Archdiocesan Intellectual Disabilities and Autism Help-Line



Do you need help accessing services and supports for someone with an intellectual disability or Autism? Through a collaborative effort of Catholic Social Services Developmental Programs, the Archdiocesan Office for Persons with Disabilities, and the Archdiocesan Schools of Special Education, this help-line can assist families and caregivers to connect to services and programs provided by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, as well as other community resources available to provide needed help and support. Steps in Accessing Services for Individuals with ID/Autism

- 1. Children/adults must register with their County Office of Intellectual Disabilities (OID)*.
 - a. *Names vary, OID in Delaware County, IDS in Philadelphia County.
 - b. The Administrative Entity (AE) will determine eligibility.
- 2. **Eligibility** documentation (see below) and **current psychological evaluation** must be reviewed by IDS before a registration appointment is scheduled.
- 3. **Intake** and Prioritization of Urgency of Need for Services (PUNS) assessment is completed with AE.
- 4. The family selects a Supports Coordination Organization (SCO) and is assigned a Supports Coordinator (SC). Family can select any SCO (home county is not required) and can change as desired.
- 5. For funding, the SC will schedule a meeting to complete a Supports Intensity Scale™ (SIS™) which is the standardized needs assessment in PA. Expect waiting lists for funding.
- 6. Families should research provider agencies and the SC will make referrals for services. Funding is connected to the SIS level, of which there are four needs groups, and seven levels of payment.

Children Autism Services are covered by medical insurance via ACT 62 (Autism Insurance Act).

Adult Waivers: Consolidated, Community Living Waiver, Person/Family Directed Support (P/FDS).

Qualifications for ID Services:

- Full Scale IQ 70 or below documented by licensed psychologist clinician prior to age 22.
 (Standardized testing Vineland II or ABAS II).
- Deficits in two or more adaptive behaviors or major life activities likely to continue indefinitely: self-care, receptive and expressive language, learning, mobility, self-direction and/or capacity for independent living, functional academic skills.
- Birth certificate and Social Security card.
- Physical exam (the SC will provide a specific form to be completed, which is required yearly).

Qualifications for Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD):

- Diagnosed before age 22 as determined by a licensed psychologist, physician, physician assistant or certified nurse practitioner using most current version DSM of Mental Disorders.
 Psychologist signature and diagnosis and rating system must be on report.
- Exhibit substantial functional limitations in three or more major life activities, likely to continue indefinitely: self-care, receptive and expressive language, learning, mobility, self-direction and/or capacity for independent living, functional academic skills, and clinical ICF/IDD or ICF/ORC (other related conditions) service eligibility of active treatment.
- Birth certificate and Social Security card.
- Physical exam (the SC will provide a specific form to be completed, which is required yearly).
