#### Distribution

  - If you have received an individual cup, place it in the basket provided on your way out the door.
- Gluten-free communion bread is available. Simply ask pastor for this option as you come forward for communion.
- A low/no-alcohol option is also available. On the tray of individual cups are several plastic
  cups that contain juice with a drop of wine included. This dilute amount of wine uses the
  element with which the Lord's Supper was instituted (wine) while providing an alternative if

Amen.
