Distribution AS YOU RECEIVE THE LORD'S SUPPER

- If—for any reason—you prefer to receive communion while remaining at your seat, please let an usher know as you arrive so that we can bring communion to you.
- Directions
 - Ushers will dismiss the congregation beginning from the back of the sanctuary.
 - o Fill the communion rail beginning from the lectern side (left).
 - Kneel or stand as you are able.
 - Pastor will distribute the body of Christ followed by the assistants with the blood of Christ (individual or common cup).
 - Once you have received the body and blood of Christ, dismiss yourself and return to your seat via the Fellowship Hall through the side door.
 - If you have received an individual cup, place it in the basket provided on your way out the door.
- Gluten-free communion bread is available. Simply ask pastor for this option as you come forward for communion.
- A low/no-alcohol option is also available. On the tray of individual cups are several
 plastic cups that contain juice with a drop of wine included. This dilute amount of wine
 uses the element with which the Lord's Supper was instituted (wine) while providing an
 alternative if needed. Please feel free to see Pastor or an Elder if you have any
 questions.


Children of the Heavenly Father

Carolina Wilhelmina Sandell Berg, commonly known as Lina Sandell, was among the most prolific and popular writers of hymns in the nineteenth-century Sweden. Her hymns were more subjective in nature and lighter in style than the hymns of the Swedish Church's *Psalmbok*, and their popularity and style earned her the nickname "the Fanny Crosby of Sweden."

A pastor's daughter, Carolina "Lina" Wilhelmina Sandell was born October 3rd, 1832, at Fröderyd, Småland, Sweden. Her childhood was marred by a paralysis at the age of twelve, from which she eventually recovered, although doctors had declared her condition incurable. She watched her father drown in a boating accident when she was twenty-six, and two years later her mother died. She then came in contact with the renowned Pietist Carl Olof Rosenius, a mystic and Revivalist lay preacher, and she joined the editorial staff of the Evangelical National Foundation. In 1867, Sandell married Carl Oscar Berg, a wealthy Stockholm merchant active in the temperance movement, and assisted him with his own literary work.


The hymn "Children of the Heavenly Father" was written when Lina Sandell was about seventeen or eighteen years old, and she published it in her *Andeliga Daggdroppar* ("Spiritual Dewdrops") in 1855. The translation by Ernst William Olson was first published in the Augustana Synod's *Hymnal and Order of Service* (1925).
