The celebration of Easter is the high-point of the Christian church-year. Everything we do and celebrate points to and flows from Jesus' death and resurrection. Something happening in the worship life of the congregation? Ask, "what does this have to do with Jesus' death and resurrection?" We could go so far as to look at EVERYTHING that we do as a congregation and ask, "What does this have to do with Jesus' death and resurrection?" Are we proclaiming it? Are we pointing our neighbors, friends, co-workers, and even ourselves to the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection? Yes? Well, then. Let's go!

All four of the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) have an account of the dramatic events of that first Easter Sunday morning. There was a lot of coming and going from the garden tomb where Jesus' body had been laid—but was no longer there! Even Jesus himself appears near the tomb. It can all be a little confusing to try and line everything up. I've prepared a chart that goes through the various appearances of Jesus after His resurrection, both immediately and in the weeks that followed. These are recorded in the Gospels, as well as 1 Corinthians 15 and the book of Acts. The important thing to remember is that each writer is writing under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and also from their own perspective. There are going to be differences in what each one records, but there aren't contradictions. Everything fits together to give us a picture of a very busy and emotional morning as the news begins to spread that Jesus was alive again and forever. From this we can have confidence that the eyewitness accounts of the resurrection are reliable and factual and given to us through God's Holy Word.

Easter is a special celebration for the church. Thank you to everyone who make our services so special this year with all their work. The music, bulletins, hymns, choirs, meals, flowers, cleaning, setting-up and taking-down all took many hands. How wonderful to be blessed with so many talented and serving people here in the Body of Christ at St. Paul! Thanks be to God!

ADOPT-A-STUDENT: Conner Forbes


Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ,





I don't know what the situation will be but confident that both children will remain in the care of Pastor and Lorna and Point of Grace in the future.

Almighty God for providing me with you. I send you my greetings from Point of Grace. I'm in Form thirpe and am working hard to fulfill my objectives as a student. My goal at the end of this academic year is to get a Bplain and get a chance to join university. I would like to be an engineer in future in order to help people in their problems. I could also get a chance to sponsor one person in future. Point of grace is a nice place with nice people who are friendly. The teachers in Point of Grace are always ready to help me in every problem that I encounter in subjects.

My hobbies that I love to do is playing football and basket ball, I love playing them during our games time in school-I went to inform you that my father is a pastor just like you are, my mum is a deaconest—I am a second born in a family of three children. My younger sister is at grade & while my older brother is at university level doing a course in teaching. I was very happy when I was informed that you offered to help mp during this academic year as my sponsor. I thank you very much for offering a chance to help mp. I hope that you are doing well together with your family. I know you are working hard to ensure that I am always in school. Thank you and may the Almight God shower you with his blessings.

Our son, Spencer, was diagnosed in 2017 with Juvenile Dermatomyositis (JDM). This is an extremely rare autoimmune disease that only affects 2-3 kids out of a million. His immune system attacks his muscles which causes muscle inflammation and pain along with weakness. Prior to his diagnosis he went from being an active 4 year old to struggling to get in and out of bed, going up stairs or even getting dressed. He would cry in pain almost every night.

After diagnosis, he was able to get relief from Prednisone and Methotrexate. By fall of 2019 we were able to wean

him off Prednisone with success. Unfortunately, he came down with a virus in February 2020 and in March of that year his disease flared. His muscles were hurting him and daily tasks became very difficult. We also began noticing Calcinosis developing in 4 different areas of the body (side effects of the disease affecting his range of motion, etc.)This time around we had more trouble getting things under control.

We were able to meet with the top specialists for JM to get some advice. In November of 2020, he began a new treatment including daily Prednisone and Colchicine, weekly shots of Methotrexate and Orencia(immunosuppressants), and Intravenous Immunoglobulin (IVIG). Spencer's IVIG treatments require him to spend a full day in Akron Children's Hospital each month.

Cure JM is an amazing organization that is dedicated to funding research and pursuing a cure. JDM is an "orphan" disease which means that due to its rarity it DOES NOT RECEIVE GOVERNMENT FUNDING like other diseases. They rely solely on fundraisers like this one. We are humbly asking for your help in raising money to support our boy along with all the other kids who are special enough to be in the 2 or 3 out of a million.
