Lord's Supper

Refreshing the Sanctuary (Facility in General)

We are approaching the 175^{th} Anniversary of the dedication of the sanctuary (rear 1/3 of our current sanctuary). 1852 - 2027.

Last major update to the interior of the sanctuary was in the mid-1990's (organ, carpet, pew pads, paint)—30+ years ago!

What would this process look like? A planning committee would need to be established and funded to engage with design/architecture firms experienced with churches to develop proposals and define the scope of the project.

NOTE: whatever is done to update things in the sanctuary and around the building the CHARACTER of St. Paul's historic worship space must be maintained. We have been blessed with a beautiful and reverent worship space that must remain so even as we equip it to function with excellence as we use to for Word and Sacrament ministry.
