LENT 2023: PROMISED TREASURES

Matthew 13:52 (ESV) — ⁵² And [Jesus] said to [the disciples], "Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house, who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old."

This Lenten season, we have a fresh opportunity to embrace in old, familiar ways and in new ways, God's amazing love for us, His baptized children. God tells us that "faith comes from hearing" (Romans 10:17), and that is one of our physical senses. We believe "that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them" (Small Catechism, Explanation of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed). God has given us ALL our senses and the Gospel is communicated through the physical senses of sight, smell, touch, and taste.

Jesus tells His disciples that a good teacher not only brings out new treasures but reminds people of old and rich treasures as well (Matthew 13:52). So, each Wednesday in Lent, we will take a weekly journey of our senses to concretely see, smell, touch, and taste a number of biblical elements: ashes, salt, water, light, bread, and palms. During Holy Week, we will encounter blood and water, wood, fragrant oil, and finally, on Easter Sunday, milk and honey. All these beautiful Old and New Testament elements will remind you of God's eternal love in Christ, fill you with renewed hope, and increase your joy, knowing that because we are His baptized children, God is near to us now more than ever.





LOCK BOX PROGRAM



The Residential Lock Box Program is intended to provide Fire, Rescue, and Police personnel access to your home in the event of an emergency where you are unable to open the door.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

All residents of Liverpool Township who are 65 and older or have special needs or a major medical disability.

IS IT SAFE?

A lock box is installed outside your home near the front door or near the carport to make Fire Department entry quick and easy in time of an emergency. Once the lock box is installed, the fire department will assist the homeowner with locking a spare key to your home inside the lock box. Every piece of fire apparatus (including the ambulance) has a key that will open the lock boxes and gain access to your key. The fire department retains these keys on the apparatus in a secure manner and would use them only in the case of an emergency.
